Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme 2023

Project Development Measure

The Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme (ORIS) supports the development of new outdoor recreational infrastructure and the necessary repair, enhancement or promotion of existing outdoor recreational infrastructure in countryside areas. The Scheme is funded under "Our Rural Future", Ireland's Rural Development Policy 2021-2025, which specifically prioritises the growing outdoor activity tourism sector as part of a long-term vision for a vibrant and sustainable rural Ireland.

This Expression of Interest (EOI) form relates to the Project Development Measure – Development Costs for Strategic Large Scale Projects – Grant up €50,000. e.g. detailed design, preparation for the planning and/or procurement, appropriate assessment screening etc. A maximum of two EOIs can be shortlisted for onward submission to the Department of Rural and Community Development. The closing date for EOI submission is 12 noon on Friday 14th July

Register Now! Exploring Just Transition in Agriculture and Land Use

Minister for Environment, Climate and Communications and Minister for Transport, Eamon Ryan TD will address the conference and formally launch NESC Report No.162 *Just Transition in Agriculture and Land Use.*

The agriculture and land use sector can increasingly be a part of the solution to addressing the climate change and biodiversity crises. This requires that the environmental challenge is addressed together with the intersecting economic and social challenges facing the sector.

Bringing together a wide range of stakeholders across the agriculture, land use, climate and environmental sectors, the event will explore the key themes and recommendations of the report. The central question the event will address is how to achieve a just transition in the agriculture and land use sector.

Based upon the analysis and recommendations in the NESC report No.162, the event will explore how the transition in agriculture and land use can be opportunities led, including diversifying incomes, supporting rural regeneration and leveraging innovative sources of finance. It will also explore how effort and costs can be equitably shared and inclusive processes for governing transition. It will draw on stakeholders' perspectives on the key next steps for ensuring a transition that supports social, economic and environmental sustainability.

Social Economy Enterprise Module



The module will provide students with: a thorough understanding of what constitutes the social economy enterprise sector, the challenges the sector faces, the contribution it can make in addressing a range of societal issues and the supports required and provided to strengthen the sector's development (A detailed prospectus will be provided)

Course Delivery: The module will be delivered via a combination of online and onsite lectures in TU Dublin, Bolton Street. It will balance theory and practice and provide students with an understanding of the skills required to develop and sustain vibrant social economy enterprises.

Course duration: Starting in October 2023, the module will conclude in May 2024.

Who should Apply: Staff and volunteers of social economy enterprises, staff of local development companies and relevant state agencies.

Assesment: Each student will be required to complete an individual assignment and participate in a group project.

Acreditation: Students who successfully complete the module will gain 10 ECT credits. These can go towards obtaining a certificate social economy enterprise development and MSc in local development and innovation.

Entry Requirements: An honours Bachelor Degree in any relevant discipline is required. However eligible candidates may be interviewed where work/career experience is being considered in lieu of academic qualifications.



We have been asked to share the below details of the following event that may be of interest "*Retrofitting Ireland: Building resilience into Irish homes'*, in partnership with Allied Irish Bank (AIB).

The event will take place on **Friday the 28th of July from 10:30am - 12.15pm** (tea and coffee served before and after the event) in the University of Limerick, Ireland. A welcome coffee will be offered from 10am, with the event starting at 10:30am. The event will also be **web streamed live on YouTube**.

The event will consist of opening addresses and a panel discussion that will focus on both the practical challenges for Irish consumers in renovating their homes and buildings and upcoming policy changes in the sector and their implications. High level speakers will include the following;

Ireland currently has around 1.7 million occupied homes. Housing a population of over five million, these homes consume about a quarter of the energy used in Ireland, as well as being responsible for 29% of energy-related greenhouse gas emissions. According to the Sustainable Energy Authority of Ireland (SEAI), Irish homes account for more emissions than the industrial sector. The average floor area of Irish homes is larger than in other EU member states and the emissions attributable to our homes in Ireland are about 58% more than the average EU home.

There is a strong potential for sustainable home renovations in Ireland due to the relatively carbon intensive housing stock, strong government climate and energy goals and support for renovation, and many single-family dwellings facilitating easier decision-making. Ireland has a strong decarbonisation target for the residential sector, with the ambition to retrofit almost 30% of the residential housing stock (500.000 homes) and install over 400.000 heat pumps.
